Preface

I pray that whoever reads this book has a spirit to hear what the Lord is saying as the Holy Spirit reveals this book in my wilderness. May your eyes and heart be opened to the Lord. My story in this book is based on how I recognized my Boaz who helped me to develop my vision that God had given me for the Kingdom. My life could relate to Ruth in many ways and I tell the story as to when, who, what, how and why. After I began to understand biblical prophecy, I just waited on the revelation to help me fulfill the will of God. My call was not to speak out in the wilderness, but to listen, write and wait on the Lord. This was being still before the Lord and waiting on his mandate to move forward in my life with the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Introduction

I would constantly hear the great stories about Boaz, and when I was single, I would hear the words, “what on your Boaz?”. What did that mean? This statement has different meanings on a person’s state of mind and emotions. It also has to do with their life experiences and how they are projecting who they believe Boaz to be based on their knowledge. What everyone said was right based on their perspective. When God took me through my experience, my Boaz was nothing like what people said. My Boaz came into my life to correct my attitude, behavior, emotions, and turn my life completely around internally from how I presented myself to the external world. He helped me to become like Christ and listen to the Holy Spirit to guide me instead of fleshly lust. He helped me put the vision God provided me into prospective so that I could fulfill the will of God for the Kingdom. My Boaz loved me, but he didn’t love my reactions. My reactions are what got me consistently into a battle of miscommunication and strife that I had to correct.

Everyone’s resurrection into Christ is different, so in my perspective I felt like I operated out of alignment in my old life,

and for God to convert, transform and shift me into who he had ordained for me to be many areas of my life had to change. The change was reflecting an image from heaven through my marriage which reminded me of the book of Ruth. Everything in my life in the past 7 years had a significant purpose that references the bible. God had given me a double portion of grace so that I could see the truth in its fullness for the finished works of Christ.

Chapter 1

How Did My Life Reflect The Book of Ruth?

After being married 10 years, my marriage ended in divorce in 2015. Why? I woke up to who I was in Christ which opened my eyes to the image surrounding me that was not of the Kingdom of God or Christ, but an image of God. I had a revelation on November 9, 2013 which was a separation in the spirit. How did I know it was a separation? It was the same experience I had a month before I was terminated from my job on September 12, 2013. I was crying, and I began to thoroughly clean and organize my home. I began to throw away everything the spirit showed me that represented idolatry. The first commandment from God is, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:3-5, KJV). My act of cleaning was honoring what the spirit showed me, and I ensured I was obedient to God's will. There was nothing I could do about what I was experiencing but go through the process. God didn't show me what was going to happen. I only had a vision of the spiritual separation. I didn't understand what I was experiencing. After I explained it to my husband at the time, he couldn't comprehend anything I was

saying. My marriage ended spiritually before it manifested physically. Christ broke the yoke off my life, and on the same day of the divorce I went to pick up my mother-in-law so that we could go shopping. I didn't know that when the relationship ended with my spouse, it would also end with my mother-in-law. No matter what words were said within the relationship such as, "I love you", "It takes a village to raise a child". None of that was true anymore. From my perspective, she didn't have anything against me, but after I moved out and on with my life our relationship changed. This reminded me of when Naomi's husband and son died. There was no longer a need for Orpah and Ruth to remain with Naomi (Book of Ruth). Although there was no purpose for children for Naomi, there was still a promise that only God could fulfill through the heart of Ruth. When the relationship with my mother-in-law was over, I had to accept it and move on like Orpah and all the memories with her died in 2015 to never be resurrected. God allowed me to go through the hurt and pain of that broken relationship, but Christ had filled the void and the Holy Spirit guided me to the truth so that I could move on with my life. It was apparent that I leaned too much on

her instead of the Lord. I learned a lot from the separation, and through the pain of the seven-year journey into the wilderness I had to forgive her and myself so God could heal me, and I would not carry that brokenness into my next relationship. The act of separation is like a death. A death can be physical or spiritual. Both has a period of tears of mourning for purification and cleansing of the soul. I have never held back tears when I have lost something or someone dearly.

Chapter 2

The Act of Separation

Although I was like Orpah in the act of separation, I was like Ruth because my spirit was in search for Boaz. I was divorced from the spirit I was bound too which had chosen not to follow Christ which is why Christ broke the yoke off my marriage and extended double grace to my life when I knew the truth in the spirit realm. I was set free, but I had to experience the repercussions of my actions which placed a financial struggle upon my life. My 1st marriage was challenging, but I assumed that all marriages have problems that never get resolved, but I refuse to believe that theory. There is a root to every problem, and I was determined to turn my marriage over to Christ to help me understand the root. Once I saw the truth through visions and dreams, the yoke was broken in the spirit and the manifestation was a physical divorce which was granted in three months after filing the papers. If you follow my story in the spirit, my physical body left the relationship which included my physical Naomi which was my mother-in-law whom I was connected to by the law of marriage and my spirit traveled in the spirit realm like

Ruth traveled with Naomi to meet Boaz. A physical marriage or a nice person that emotionally, mentally or physically appealed doesn't guarantee that you have your Boaz especially if you are a child of God and following in the footsteps of Christ. God can use anyone to grab your attention and place you on a path of repentance towards redemption. God uses everyone and any circumstances to bring you back to him. In my situation, God used my 1st marriage as a platform for me to return to him. I had strayed away from what was pure, and it was time for me to return. There are many areas about God that I will never know, but I do know that I dwell in the secret place with him and every step he ordered he walked before me. He already made provisions for my life.

Chapter 3

God's Provision

Through my trials and tribulations, 3 months after the divorce, I returned home with my father in Stone Mountain, Georgia. In the spirit, I was back with God who was protecting and covering me for his purpose. My father's heart had turned towards me knowing that I couldn't financially make it on my own. God made provisions for me during my time of trouble. In the spirit I could also see that I was like the "prodigal son" that returned home to his father (Luke 15:11-32, ESV).

Chapter 4

My Mirror of Redemption

My husband's spirit belongs to God which is why he was able to help, protect and stabilized my environment for me to develop the vision God showed me. He was like Joseph was to Mary. I had a divine baby growing in me and I needed to nourish and develop it for the finished works of Christ. In this relationship, I was mirroring heaven through my husband's spirit so that I could manifest what the mirror was showing me. He reflected to me through his mind and emotions what heaven was seeing in the mirror. Through the good and bad, I was becoming who God ordained for me to be on earth as it was in heaven. None of this could happen if I was not saved in 1987 and born again on January 14, 2013. I did a lot of repenting and turning from behaviors that were not like Christ and was unacceptable for the Kingdom of God. The relationship was my threshing floor that God used while I sat at the feet of Christ like the woman with the Alabaster box who washed Jesus feet (Luke 7:37). The same examples as Ruth who sat at Boaz feet on the threshing floor humbly waiting for his response (Ruth 3:4). Both

these women had 2 things in common. They were both humble at the feet of the spirit of God (Jesus and Boaz). As of July 31, 2020, I am headed to God's promised which he said on January 14, 2013. As I write this book, I am on my 6th day of fasting from the unclean foods I consumed such as junk food, candy, and meat. My last meat was chicken in a salad on Sunday. We were out longer than I expected on Sunday so I had to eat something so I wouldn't feel weak. My life is shifting into the Kingdom while I am spiritually in the Garden of Eden.

The book of Ruth has many meanings in my life, but the meaning that designates in my spirit is "Redemption". To redeem Ruth, Boaz had to ensure the next in kin was not willing to redeem her and in those days the redeemer redeemed the land with the women. Since Ruth's closest redeemer chose not to take the offer, Boaz was in line as the redeemer. I saw this through my male friend in 2017, who became my fiancé at the beginning of 2018, who became my husband at the end of 2018. They that worship God must worship him in spirit and in truth, so everything that I have gone through in the past 7 years was redemption for the glory of God and to see the body of Christ

resurrect in the natural. Another sign of the reflection from heaven was our visits to Stone Mountain by the lake. At night during the summer months, the moon reflects off the surface of the lake between the bell and the ferris wheel boat. This was our location to meet and reflect on our relationship.

Redemption is an act of redeeming atoning for a fault or mistake, or the state of being [redeemed](#) (Dictionary.com) The biblical meaning is, “to pay a price in order to secure the release of something or someone” (Holman Reference) From 1/14/2013 through 10/10/2020, I was going through redemption in the spirit, but the results would be manifested once it was time to birth what God wanted me to harvest. Jesus Christ already paid the price. The only thing I had to do was believe and not to operate by sight because everything manifested was from a spiritual realm. I was incubating the gift God had given to me for his glory. Ruth is part of the lineage of Jesus Christ through Boaz, so I see Boaz as the spirit of Christ to continue the promises and blessings of God. I see Ruth as submitting to Christ. Although Jesus was not visible, the spirit of Christ was present in the book of Ruth. I could see it in Boaz’s behavior

towards Ruth. Her purpose was to be redeemed by Boaz to birth Obed and continue towards the birth of Jesus Christ. My husband was my Boaz because through marriage, I was redeemed to birth my role in the Kingdom that God had showed me for the past seven years. This is the greatest love story that showed me how Christ redeemed me through my Boaz. I didn't even recognize him because he didn't look or act like I expected. I was looking at the flesh and not operating by the spirit. It took me almost three years to recognize what the spirit was saying to me. My Boaz job was to provide stability and protection so I could be purified, rebuild so I could be prepared for my Lord Jesus Christ. It wasn't about glamour to plan a wedding. It was about completing the work and preparing me to meet the living Christ. So, my Boaz helped birthed what the spirit was saying to me physically and spiritually. During this process, I went through similar activities as Ruth starting with releasing old mindsets and people from my life so that I could have room for the new.

1. I had to **release the old** to except the new.

2. I had to **listen** to hear the instructions from the Holy Spirit (wisdom).
3. I had to **labor** (glean) before the Lord.
4. I had to be **recognized** by the Lord through my faith. Faith was my job.
5. I had to get on the **threshing floor** before my Lord.
6. I had to **wait** on the Lord.
7. I was **redeemed** by the Lord.

There is always a process in redeeming a person or a nation. The purpose of Christ dying on the cross was to redeem a nation. That nation has individual people involved that know their Lord and Savior. This story reminded me of Abraham's Servant who was required to find a wife for Isaac. When the Servant found Rebekah, she left her family trusting God. It also reminded me of Queen Ester when she put her people before her position. Queen Ester fasted and prayed to save her people. Her power was not in her position. Her power was in prayer. These are the most powerful three women in the bible, and I am grateful that God gave me a revelation of them during my journey through the wilderness.

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
